Step Task






Fig. 3: Fixed Mast Brackets Attached To The Antenna

- 1 Attach one fixed mast bracket to the top mounting brace, as shown in Fig. 2 and 3. Refer to the materials list shown in Fig. 1 to properly identify the required items.
- 2 Attach the other fixed mast bracket to the bottom mounting brace, as shown in Fig. 2 and 3. Refer to the materials list shown in Fig. 1 to properly identify the required items.
- 3 Adjust the position of the threaded rod on the antenna side of brackets as required. Torque nuts to 54 N·m (40 ft-lbs).

Fig. 2: Fixed Mast Brackets

Step Task

- 4 Lift the antenna up to the mast location to continue assembly.
- 5 Align the antenna in the direction specified by the site engineer. The orientation of the antenna is normal to the sector unless specifically required otherwise.
- 6 Secure the antenna to the mast and torque all mounting fasteners to 54 N·m (40 ft-lbs). Refer to Antenna Installation Guide.
